### Scholarships and Bursaries

It is the student's responsibility to seek out scholarships and bursaries. However, many will be advertised in our monthly newsletter. Always do your own research thoroughly. Some useful websites will be listed on the EOM website. Application forms can usually be completed online but hard copies will be in Student Services when available. Students should check the websites for each institution that they apply to.

There may be an EOM deadline date as well as the institution deadline. This usually occurs when the school can nominate students.

**Please allow 10 days for a reference letter request from either a Guidance counsellor or teacher.**

**Allow at least 3-5 days for ordering of transcripts from Student Services.**

**Students must keep all Student Services deadlines when transcripts, reference letters or nominations are required.**

### **The Loran Award**

High level of academic performance (85%+), leadership and a record of community service to the community. Awards are only available at certain universities. 30 Loran Awards each of these awards is worth up to \$75,000. They also grant 42 finalist awards and 40 provincial awards. Awards are only available at certain universities.

This year, part of the application process is online. Applicants must complete their application online, then download the completed PDF. You must mail the complete application, along with transcript. Mailing instructions are included in the PDF. Awards are only available at certain universities. Deadline for all sponsored applicants is October 6th to Ms. Gervais in Student Services. We may sponsor up to 3 applicants.

Deadline for all direct pool applicants is October 26th to the Toronto address.

## Inside Story Headline

---

This story can fit 100-150 words.

The subject matter that appears in newsletters is virtually endless. You can include stories that focus on current technologies or innovations in your field.

You may also want to note business or economic trends, or make predictions for your customers or clients.

If the newsletter is distributed internally,

you might comment upon new procedures or improvements to the business. Sales figures or earnings will show how your business is growing.

Some newsletters include a column that is updated every issue, for instance, an advice column, a book review, a letter from the president, or an

editorial. You can also profile new employees or top customers or vendors.

## Inside Story Headline

---

This story can fit 75-125 words.

Selecting pictures or graphics is an important part of adding content to your newsletter.

Think about your article and ask yourself if the picture supports or enhances the message you’re trying to convey. Avoid selecting images that appear to be out of context.

Microsoft Publisher includes thousands of clip art images from which you can choose and import into your newsletter. There are also several tools you can use to draw shapes and symbols.

Once you have chosen an image, place it close to the article. Be sure to place the caption of the image near the image.

## Back Page Story Headline

This story can fit 175-225 words.

If your newsletter is folded and mailed, this story will appear on the back. So, it's a good idea to make it easy to read at a glance.

A question and answer session is a good way to quickly capture the attention of readers. You can either compile questions that you've received since the last edition or you can summarize some generic questions that are frequently asked about your organization.

A listing of names and titles of managers in your organization is a good way to give your newsletter a personal touch. If your organization is small, you may want to list the names of all employees.

If you have any prices of standard products or services, you can include a listing of those here. You may want to refer your readers to

any other forms of communication that you've created for your organization.

You can also use this space to remind readers to mark their calendars for a regular event, such as a breakfast meeting for vendors every third Tuesday of the

month, or a biannual charity auction.

If space is available, this is a good place to insert a clip art image or some other graphic.
